### TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT

To facilitate safe and timely progress of construction along Mannum Road, Downer will split the construction work along Mannum Road into two stages. Specific traffic management plans will be established for both stages and motorists are reminded to adhere to the reduced speed limits throughout the site.

Stage 1 commenced on 20 July, with Stage 2 scheduled to commence in August.

Road users are reminded to continue to be vigilant within the construction zone and adhere to the displayed road works speed limits.
