



Bridge Street and Sixth Street Revitalisation Design Project

BRIDGE STREET

Traders ask Council to develop and consult with the community on two “options” for Bridge Street (rather than one). Council agrees...timeframe extended to consider the two options. Consultation on the two options for Bridge Street likely to occur in early 2015.

Following recent engagement with traders and main street property owners in May and June 2014, Council received a request from Main Street traders to develop two options for Bridge Street rather than just one.

The original option examines a layout with two traffic lanes in each direction.

- The additional option would examine a layout with one traffic lane in each direction providing greater opportunities for landscaping, outdoor dining, public seating and a more vibrant town centre.

The traders requested consultation with the community on both options.

At its meeting on 7 July 2014, Council resolved to extend the Bridge Street Revitalisation Design programme. This will provide more time to undertake further design investigations and traffic assessment, and then undertake consultation with Murray Bridge community on both options for Bridge Street.

SIXTH STREET

Murray Bridge community will be asked to comment on the option that has now been developed for Sixth Street in August 2014.

Consultation will take place over a three week period starting on 28 July. You will have the opportunity to see plans on display and on Council's website, and talk about your ideas with the design team.

A workshop with traders on the Sixth Street option will also be held.

Details will be provided to you shortly in the next Fact Sheet, and also posted on Council's website.

Consulting soon means that Council can continue the program and momentum for Sixth Street Revitalisation, and subject to funding, construction works could commence in 2015.
