#### Identification

RCMB building assets represent a significant investment by Council that supports our community. This annual investment ensures maintenance of our buildings and it is imperative that the Council employs the most appropriate management skills and practices to ensure that related services are delivered economically and sustainably.

Council's building assets are provided to meet the needs of the community in line with our four strategic themes.

As a commitment towards delivery of the Council's Strategic Plan, a comprehensive Building Renewal Program is planned for 2021-22 that contributes positively to maintaining and improving our Corporate and Community Building infrastructure.

## The Purpose

The objective of the Building Renewal Program is to:

- Ensure that its buildings are maintained at a safe and functional standard as set out in the Asset Management Plan.
- Ensure that its buildings are renewed or replaced as appropriate in order to achieve best asset productivity.
- Ensure that Council achieves acceptable service delivery and financial sustainability.

Council needs to ensure key functional objectives are met by:

- Providing buildings that meet agreed targets of safety and function.
- Providing and maintain buildings that meet the community's requirements within the resources available.
- Managing buildings to statutory requirements and community needs.
- Providing buildings and facilities that are fit for purpose.

## **Building Renewal Program**

Council's building assets portfolio is quite diverse and to assist with this each building has been categorised into levels based on its function.

In order for the Rural City of Murray Bridge to deliver on its four strategic themes, and in line with the endorsed Building Asset Management Plan a budget allocation of \$650,000 has been proposed for the 2021/22 Annual Business Plan and Budget to fund renewal works for Category 1 and Category 2 Buildings
