CONDITIONS OF EXEMPTION CONSENT:

- 1. The audible bird scaring device is to be used in accordance with the details provided within the application unless otherwise altered by the following conditions.
- 2. The applicant must ensure that any local nuisance created from the approved activity is appropriately managed and that reasonable measures are implemented to minimise any potential nuisance.
- 3. The audible bird scaring device must be located at the eastern aspect of the property situated at 2 Tolmer Street, Wellington. The device must face towards the Murray River when being activated.
- 4. The audible bird scaring device shall only be operated as follows:
 - a. Between 28 February 2024 and 20 March 2024
 - i. 3 single shots can be fired between the hours of 8:30am and 5:00pm, Monday to Friday;
 - ii. 1 single shot can be fired between the hours of 9:00am and 5:00pm on Saturday and Sunday.
 - b. Between 21 March 2024 and 28 May 2024
 - i. 1 double shot between the hours of 8:30am and 10:30am, and 4:00pm and 6:00pm, Monday to Friday
 - ii. 1 double shot between the hours of 8:30am and 10:30am on Saturday and Sunday.
- 5. The communication notice proforma must be updated and provided to council prior to the approved activity occurring, and include the following details:
 - o The nature of the proposed activity;
 - The start and finish dates for the activity;
 - o The daily start and finish times for the activity;
 - o The anticipated sources of the local nuisance generated by the activity;
 - o The proposed measures to be implemented to minimise the local nuisance;
 - o The name and contact details of the person who may be contacted by potentially affected persons regarding concerns or complaints in relation to the activity.
- 6. Prior to commencing the use of the bird scaring device the community must be advised of the proposed use of the bird scaring device including the terms of its operation.
- 7. The register for recording complaints must be updated and provided to council prior to the approved activity occurring, and include the following details:
 - o Contact details for each complainant; and
 - o The date and time for each complaint; and
 - o A description of the complaint; and
 - o The nature of the activity giving rise to the complaint; and
 - o Any action taken to address the complaint.
- 8. The applicant must ensure that any local nuisance created from the approved activity is appropriately managed and that reasonable measures are implemented to minimise any potential nuisance.
- 9. The responsible person must provide written communication to the council each fortnight that provides an update on the progress of the activity and the site nuisance management plan; including a report of any incidents or complaints.
- 10. The dates and times that the audible bird scaring device is used must be recorded and reported to council.

ADVISORY NOTES:

- This exemption will expire after 3 months from the date of the decision.
- Failure to comply with the requirements of this declaration may result in council, varying or revoking this approval.
- The applicant shall consider possible noise attenuation investigations, or physical options to minimise the noise impacts.
- To ensure the effectiveness of the bird scaring device the proposed hours of usage can be reviewed during the course of the exemption period in consultation with Council and the community.
