There's lots of work to be done still.


There are a lot of great ideas out there and working together is how we harness the best ideas to build the thriving and prosperous communities we all want.

# **COMMUNITY CONSULTATION + STRATEGIC PLANNING**



**RESIDENTS TOOK THE OPPORTUNITY TO CHAT FACE-TO-FACE WITH COUNCIL STAFF,** THE CEO AND MAYOR, DURING THE LET'S THRIVE COMMUNITY WORKSHOPS

CONVERSATIONS with community to determine Council's priorities for the next four years have generated some exciting ideas and a lot to think about as part of the Let's Thrive consultation.

Feedback received from residents and businesses will inform development of the next Strategic Plan 2024-2028.

Council held one Dynamic Economy industry meeting, nine community meetings in our townships and two staff drop-in sessions, along with a paper and online survey to gather as much feedback as possible during August.

Common themes identified as priorities by residents included planning, road maintenance and infrastructure, services, the environment, lifestyle, activation, transport, tourism, youth and events.

While each group had unique concerns specific to them, such as the Erskine Bridge in Callington, fire prevention at Rockeigh and the wetlands on Eastside.

What was made clear is that people are passionate about where they live and they want to be involved in helping to shape their communities and their future.

The Mayor attended every workshop and spoke to as many people as he could.

A full report will be presented to Elected Members in October to consider all the feedback and ideas gathered.

A draft Strategic Plan document will be developed from that and this will go back out for community consultation early next year to make sure we heard you correctly and that we got the detail right.

# **MAYORS ROAD SHOW**

OPPORTUNITIES to create meaningful connection, understand aspirations and address resident concerns first hand, have inspired the Mayor and Chief Executive Officer to introduce regular drop-in sessions in a road show style tour.

Mayor Wayne Thorley and CEO Heather Barclay have been enthusiastically engaging with residents during the Let's Thrive community workshops as part of the Strategic Plan consultation.

The positive response from residents to talk with Council's decision makers face to face has inspired a series of drop-in sessions with the Mayor and CEO that will include a tour through our outer townships.

This approachable new style of community engagement aims to open a direct line of communication and create an ongoing conversation, where all residents have the opportunity to help shape the future of their neighbourhoods.

The first drop-in session was held at the Wellington Progress Association Hall in September and next one will be held at Mypolonga in October - more details will available closer to the day.

## **RIVER RECOVERY**



### BELLA IS HAPPY THIELE RESERVE PLAYGROUND HAS REOPENED NOW FLOOD DAMAGED SOFTFALL HAS BEEN REPAIRED

### THIELE Reserve playground is open once again following flood damage repairs as the Murray River flood recovery continues.

The playground was out of action for nine months due to the impact of the flood.

Specialist contractors are now working on playground repairs for Woodlane Reserve at Mypolonga (set to reopen in time for the school holidays), to be followed by Sturt Reserve playground repairs in early October.

Council has completed most of the recovery work needed for our roads and infrastructure, however some roads remain under water in the Mobilong area and we continue to monitor and reopen all roads as soon as they're safe. The downstream end of Thiele Reserve remains fenced off due to bank destabilisation.

Planning is underway with the Department for Environment and Water to remove the temporary Mypolonga levee bank installed to save the town from flooding last summer.

Storage areas along the river are currently at capacity, but there are no excessively high flows expected this summer.

New planning rules are in place to help the rebuilding effort and mitigate the impact of future flood events along the River Murray.

The Planning and Design Code has been amended to provide clearer guidance for impacted communities for more flood resilient development.

# **TOUR DOWN UNDER**



RACE DIRECTOR STUART O'GRADY OAM IS EXCITED TO INTRODUCE A NEW RACE START AT MURRAY BRIDGE

### AN INTERNATIONAL spotlight will focus on Murray Bridge in January as cyclists from around the globe converge on our Rural City for the 2024 SANTOS Tour Down Under.

Murray Bridge will host the introduction of a brand new route for the largest cycling race in the Southern hemisphere beginning in our main street.

The Hahn Men's Stage Four: Murray Bridge – Port Elliot will start at 11.10am in Bridge Street, Murray Bridge, on Friday 19 January.

Hosting this prestigious event will provide an opportunity to showcase our beautiful stretch of the river and our recovery after last summers flood, as riders cross our newly restored historical bridge once racing begins.

After kicking off in Murray Bridge, cyclists will follow the route through Tailem Bend, Wellington, Strathalbyn and Goolwa, before ending in Port Elliot for the first time.

Cyclists will cover a distance of 136.2km providing plenty of excitement along the way.

The event is expected to attract a large number of visitors, stimulating the local economy and providing invaluable support to local businesses.

Riders, their teams, media and spectators will all be encouraged to see the sights and enjoy our hospitality.

Our resilience, the beauty of our rejuvenated river and the opportunities for tourists to discover it for themselves will be shared around the world.

Many will remember the crowds when Murray Bridge hosted the Santos Women's Tour Down Under Novatech Stage 2 race, the Santos Tour Down Under Stage 4 and Westpac Challenge Tour in 2020.
