YOUNG people can connect to guidance and support with the help of a handy new contact card created in collaboration with local youth services.

The 'Here If You Need' card is a free colourful pocket-sized card, filled with contact details for youth support services available within The Rural City of Murray Bridge region.

Murray Bridge Wellbeing Hub Project Officer Bridgette Syrus said "the card aims to empower and support young people who find trying to access support services daunting and confusing."

"The card covers a wide range of areas from mental health and wellbeing to housing, legal services, financial assistance, community services and much more." she said.

"Additionally, the card isn't just for young people – it can be used by community and the services who work alongside young people and their families."

The card is a joint collaboration between the Murray Bridge Wellbeing Hub, Planet Youth Murray Bridge and The Station, all of which are local services aimed at supporting and championing young people in the Murray Bridge region.

Planet Youth Murray Bridge Project Officer Samara O'Toole said creation of the card was a great opportunity for local service collaboration.

"Planet Youth is about increasing the protective factors around alcohol and other drugs, so it is important that young people know what services are available to them in an easy to access format," she said.

"Planet Youth is community driven, making this the perfect opportunity for collaboration to support our young people."

Feedback on the cards content and design was provided by local young people involved in the Rural City of Murray Bridge Youth Council and The Station programs.
