Community Update

December, 2017

Council's new By-Laws were gazetted on 5 January 2017. By-Law No.2 for Local Government Land has a provision for boats mooring on Riverfront Reserves.

A person must not, without the permission of the Council:

"7.10.6 Moor any boat on or to local government land other than in accordance with such time limits and other conditions determined by resolution of the Council and set out in a notice on or in the immediate vicinity of the land to which the time limits or other conditions apply."



Council at its meeting of 11 December 2017 approved a 48 hour timeframe for temporary mooring of vessels at approved riverfront reserves with the condition that after the 48 hour period they either move to another Reserve, with no return permitted within 24 hours, or apply for a permit to stay longer.

The following Reserves have been approved for the 48 hour timeframe and conditions of mooring:

- Snakey Gully Reserve
- Woodlane Reserve
- Toora Reserve (North)
- Toora Reserve (South)
- Avoca Dell Reserve
- Hume Reserve
- Wharf Precinct
- Sturt Reserve
- Long Island Reserve
- Swanport Wetlands
- Swanport Reserve
- Bells Landing
- River Vine Reserve
- Hahn Reserve
- Riverglen Reserve
- Murrundi Reserve
- Baker Reserve

The following reserves **are not** listed for houseboat moorings due to other recreational water activities being conducted at these reserves:

- Tumbella Reserve
- Swanport Aquatic Centre
- Murrawong Reserve
- Queen Louisa Reserve
- Thiele Reserve

To seek a permit the applicant will be required to complete a "Hire of Council Facility" application form and email the form to records@murraybridge.sa.gov.au or drop into the Customer Service area at the Local Government Centre, 2 Seventh Street, Murray Bridge. The fee for mooring longer than 48 hours is set by Council in its Fees and Charges Schedule and is currently \$62 per day.
