# Sixth Street Revitalisation

## Community Update Number 15 October 2016

### Construction Update

The new road and footpath pavements in Zone 5 of the 'Sixth Street Revitalisation Project' have been completed, and the northern end of Sixth Street (between Fourth Street and Fifth Street) has been re-opened to vehicle traffic. Part of Zone 1 (i.e. South Terrace) will also be re-opened to vehicle traffic this week.

### Construction Staging

In consultation with local traders, the construction staging has been refined to enable the new road pavements along Sixth Street to be completed in mid December 2016. This will restore normal traffic conditions and parking availability prior to the Christmas period. To achieve this accelerated program Construction Zone 2 (between Bridge Street and Mitre 10) and Zone 4 (between Bridge Street and Fifth Street) will be undertaken at the same time. Please see overleaf the updated Staging Plan.

### Open for Business

All local traders will remain 'open for business' throughout the construction works, with pedestrian access to shops and businesses available at all times. The staging of the works also means that there is plenty of parking available for visitors to the Sixth Street precinct. Please take the opportunity to visit your favourite shops on Sixth Street, and to watch the project unfold.
