Construction Update

Water main renewal works have been completed in Zone 2 (between Bridge Street and Mitre 10) and a number of the remaining concrete pavements have been poured and ready for block paving. The team from 'Outside Ideas' are working hard to complete the new block paving of the road and footpaths in this Zone, and will progressively shrink the size of the work zone ahead of Sixth Street being fully re-opened to pedestrian and vehicle traffic before Christmas.

Following the installation of the new water main in Zone 4 (between Bridge Street and Fifth Street), the pavement construction for the western parking lane is now underway and will be completed before Christmas. The team from 'Outside Ideas' have also made a head start on the new footpath paving in front of the Murray Bridge Hotel, with the remaining footpath paving in this zone to be completed in the New Year.

Don't forget that Zones 1 and 5 as well as South Terrace have now been completed and are open to traffic and pedestrians.

The hardwood bollards and permanent traffic signage will also be installed before Christmas with the remaining street furniture, trees and shrubs will arrive to site in the New Year.

Open for Business

All local traders will remain 'open for business' throughout the construction works, with pedestrian access to shops and businesses available at all times. The staging of the works also means that there is plenty of parking available for visitors to the Sixth Street precinct.
