Construction Update

With the new block paving of the road and a majority of the footpaths completed in December, Sixth Street was fully opened to pedestrian and vehicle traffic over the Christmas and New Year holiday period. Drivers are reminded that Sixth Street 'south' is now a one-way street heading southwards from the Bridge Street intersection (towards the MarketPlace) so vehicles can no longer enter Sixth Street from South Terrace.

Outside Ideas have now returned to site and the focus for January is the completion of the remaining footpath in Zone 4 and the new kerbing on the northern side of Bridge Street. In February, after the school holiday period has concluded, the remaining works on the Bridge Street intersection will be undertaken. The installation of street furniture and trees will also take place throughout January and February.
