



FERRIES MCDONALD ROAD REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT

Update Number 30

24th May 2013

With the section of new road through Ferries McDonald Conservation Park almost completed the Department of Planning, Transport and Infrastructure has now granted approval to apply an 80km/h speed limit to the section between the intersections of Chauncey's Line Road and Garwood Road.

In accordance with the above and the requirements of Commonwealth approval, signs have also been placed at each end of the Conservation Park indicating an advisory speed of 60km/h and wording reminding drivers to Care for Our Endangered Malleefowl.



Major earthworks continue to the north of Garwood Road, and on the new alignment adjacent to Monarto Conservation Park.

The Project has recently been audited by an independent authority for the Commonwealth Government to ensure compliance of the conditions of Commonwealth Approval in relation to protection of flora and fauna.

Road users are reminded to continue to be vigilant within the construction zone and adhere to road works speed limits of 25km/h during the day (while works are underway) and 40km/h at all other times.
