



# FERRIES MCDONALD ROAD REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT

**General Manager, Infrastructure and Environment Simon Bradley, Project Manager, Paul Holmes and Project Superintendent, Joel Eckermann recently reporting on the works progress.**

The Murray Valley Standard recently reported that Council is happy with the Ferries McDonald Road Redevelopment's progress. The project is on track and on budget. The most controversial section of the road, the stretch adjacent to the Ferries McDonald Conservation Park is now complete and Council is now expecting the job to be finished on time and on Budget.

Council is expecting to have the project completed by April 2014 and hopes to begin re-vegetation works shortly. Seedlings have been propagated from vulnerable plant species in the area and as importantly, the endangered Malleefowl that live there have survived the works untouched.

The Ferries McDonald Road project has been in the works for several years and will form a strategic major freight link between the Langhorne Creek and Barossa Valley wine regions once completed.
