

Recycling Right

Over 70% of SA's waste gets recycled. But a lot of valuable resources that could be recycled are still going to landfill. Don't let your recycling go to waste.

The Rural City of Murray Bridge is one of five Council's given the opportunity to participate as a pilot Council for a recycling education campaign being developed by Zero waste SA in collaboration with the Local Government Association and with the assistance of Visy Recycling.

The campaign aims to increase awareness about;

- Correct recycling and to reduce contamination in kerbside waste collections for householders with three bin systems.
- Educate, encourage and reinforce the benefits of recycling,
- Provide concise information on what can be recycled,
- Through education, reduce 'contaminated' material deposited in green organics and dry recyclables in kerbside collected bins and
- Ultimately, reduce the amount of waste going to landfill.
